

2025 HUNGARIAN SURFING CHAMPIONSHIP

COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT

1. SCOPE, PUBLICATION AND AMENDMENT OF THE COMPETITION ANNOUNCEMENT

- 1.1 The competition regulations apply to all competitions in the championship series. The individual competitions in the championship series (hereinafter referred to as: competition), their locations, organizing organizations and participating classes are listed in Appendix 1.
- 1.2 The competition announcement and its amendments are www.hwa.hu are published on the website.

2. RULES

- 2.1 The competitionIn the racing rules of sailing (hereinafter referred to as RRS). Appendix B of the RRS applies.
- 2.2 In all rules applicable to the competition
 - (a) "athlete" or "competitor" means a person participating or intending to participate in a competition.
 - (b) [NP]indicates a rule whose alleged breach cannot be the basis for a protest by a surfer. This modifies rule RRS 60.1(a).
- 2.3 In the event of any conflict between languages, the English text shall prevail.
- 2.4 Additional rules for the slalom and speed classes are presented in Appendix 2.

3. COMPETITION INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 The Competition Instructions shall be sent electronically to the <u>www.hwa.hu</u> will be available on the website. A printed copy of the competition instructions will be posted on the official notice board.

4. COMMUNICATION

- 4.1 [[DP]Except in an emergency or using equipment provided by the organizing organization, a surfer in competition may not transmit or receive any voice or data connection that is not available to all surfers.
- 4.2 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located near the competition office.
- 4.3 Amendments to the Racing Instructions will be posted no later than two hours before the scheduled time of the race in which they will come into effect. Amendments to the race schedule will be posted until 20:00 on the day before they come into effect.
- 4.4 The location of the race office and the shore markings is included in the Race Instructions.

5. [DP] RULES OF CONDUCT

5.1 Competitors and support personnel shall comply with all reasonable requests from competition officials.

6. ELIGIBILITY, REGISTRATION AND REGISTRATION

6.1 Surfers from the following classes can participate in the championship series:

- 6.2 The entry of competitors with Hungarian citizenship is valid if they meet the following conditions:
 - (a) is a member of a member association of the Hungarian Surfing Association, which has paid its membership fee for 2025.
 - (b) has a valid sports medical certificate or, in the case of age groups under 14, a starting permit (a starting permit is a sports medical or general practitioner's certificate allowing a single competition, the date of which cannot be earlier than the 15th day before the competition day and cannot be later than the day before the first competition day), which must be submitted to thenevezes@hwa.hu email address);
 - (c) in possession of a valid sports medical license, he/she has renewed his/her 2025 competition license (the competition license is valid until December 31, 2025, but no later than the validity of the sports medical license; in possession of a renewed sports medical license, the competition license can be extended free of charge within the year) or his/her starting license.
- 6.3 Competitors who are not Hungarian citizens must be members of an association or organization recognized by a national authority affiliated with World Sailing.
- 6.4 Application for a competition permit<u>www.hwa.hu</u> competition permit application form downloadable from the website (https://hwa.hu/dokumentumtar/770/VERSENYEN-GED%C3%89LY%20K%C3%89R%C5%90%20LAP%202025%20aflikozattal The competition permit application form (with a valid sports doctor's permit) must be submitted in printed or digital form, in person or by e-mail to the office of the Hungarian Surfing Association (1065 Budapest, Podmaniczky utca 12.,nevezes@hwa.hu). Documents sent by e-mail are considered accepted if the office has confirmed the e-mail. Athletes who are under 18 years of age at the time of applying for a competition permit must complete the competition permit application form and submit it to the https://documents.nih.gov/ a competition permit can be used to enter a competition if it is requested no later than 12:00 on the day before the first competition day.

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¹In the Techno 293 class, competitors born in 2011, 2012 or 2013 must specify when registering whether they will compete in the U17 or U15 category.

₂In the Open Foil class, competitors born in 2009 or later must specify when registering whether they are competing in the Absolute or U17 category.

³In the iQFoil class, competitors born in 2007 or later must specify when registering whether they will compete in the Absolute or U19 category.

- 6.5 Entry for competitions organized in Hungary:
 - In a championship class, it is possible to enter the entire competition series once, which is valid for all competitions in that class, or it is possible to enter a specific competition separately. Entry methods:
 - (a) by sending the "Entry Form for the entire competition series" document or the "Entry Form" document for a specific competition to the office of the Hungarian Surfing Association by 12:00 on the day before the first competition day, or
 - (b) at the competition venue during the registration period specified in the Competition Instructions, or
 - (c) registration for a given competition on the Hungarian Surfing Association website (www.hwa.hu) is also possible, until 12:00 on the day before the first competition day.
- 6.6 The rules of the given competition govern the entry into competitions not organized in Hungary.
- 6.7 Competitors participating in the competition must register at the competition office during the registration period. For competitions in slalom and speed classes, Appendix 2 may require a different registration method.
- 6.8 When at least 3 surfers of each gender are not registered in a class or, if any, age category in a competition, the gender categories will not be applied.

7. PARTICIPATION FEES

7.1 Membership fee, competition license:

(a) annual membership fee for member associations of the Hungarian Surfing Association: 20,000 HUF.

(b) the annual competition license fee for competitors: 5,000 HUF/person, for those born on or after January 1, 2013 and on or before December 31, 1964: 2,000 HUF/person.

In the case of competitions held in Torbole and Viganj (Formula Foil European Championships), it will cover the entry fee in part or in full: 100% for selected "A" squad members, 75% for "B" squad members, and 50% for the others.

- * Discounted entry fee for the championship series until May 15, 2025,can be applied to entries finalized by fulfilling the participation requirements listed in point 6. A valid sports doctor's license is not a condition for discounted entry.
- * * The entry fee of HUF 10,000 for the Hungarian Slalom Foil Championship (Viganj) will be covered by the association for all competitors who have a valid competition entry for any foil class.
- 7.3 The annual competition license and entry fees can be paid in cash or by bank transfer. Bank transfer details:

8. EQUIPMENT

8.1 The equipment that can be used in each class is listed in the table below:

- 8.2 Surfboards may be inspected at any time during the competition to ensure they comply with the class rules or the equipment rules of 8.1.
- 8.3 Penalties for breaches of the class rules, RRS rule 50 or the equipment rules of 8.1 may be less than disqualification at the discretion of the protest committee.

9. [NP] [DP] INSURANCE

- 9.1 All responsible persons (competitors, see RRS rule 46) must have valid liability insurance covering at least EUR 1,000,000 or its equivalent in each case. Recommended insurance: https://cp.vdws.de/safetytool/
- 9.2 The organization may check, but is not responsible for, verifying the validity of insurance.

10. [DP] IDENTIFICATION AND ADVERTISEMENTS

- 10.1 When provided by the organizing body, surfers or competitors may be required to place, display or wear the following as directed: (a) jerseys for all competitors,
 - (b) event announcements,
 - (c) cameras, and
 - (d) tracking devices.
- 10.2 When the organising body requires the placement and display of event advertisements, the stickers shall be placed on each side of the sail, in the area between the two battens above the boom, immediately below the top batten of the area, parallel to it, starting no more than 150 mm from the aft edge of the sail. Appendix 3 provides examples of the placement of event advertisements on some sails.
- 10.3 When the organizing body requires the use of tracking devices, they must be worn by all surfers involved at all times on the water. Tracking devices are available at the race office from 90 minutes before the scheduled warning signal for the first race of the day. Tracking devices must be returned to the same location each day within the class's own protest deadline.

11. TIME ALLOCATION

- 11.1 The scheduled time for the first race warning signal is 10:00 a.m. on the first day of competition.
- 11.2 On the last scheduled day of competition, the last scheduled warning signal time is 16:00.
- 11.3 The detailed time schedule is included in the Competition Instructions.

12. CLASS FLAGS

12.1 The class flags are listed in the table below.

13. COMPETITION AREA, COMPETITION TRACKS AND SIGNS

13.1 The competition area, the competition tracks and the markings that delimit them are included in the Competition Instructions.

14. START

- 14.1 For Open Foil and iQFOiL classes, RRS rule 26 is amended to provide that the warning signal shall be given three minutes before the starting signal and the preparatory signal shall be given two minutes before the starting signal.
- 14.2 In order to warn surfers, in the event of a race or starting procedure about to begin, an orange flag will be displayed at the starting line with a sound signal at least two minutes before the warning signal.
- 14.3 New RRS 27.4: The race committee may indicate that surfers must be on a certain tack during the 10 seconds before and after the starting signal by displaying a green flag for a right tack and a red flag for a left tack no later than the warning signal.
- 14.4 [[DP]Surfers whose warning signal has not yet been given must move away from the start area during the start procedure of the other races. The start area is a distance of 50 meters from any point on the start line.
- 14.5 A surfer who does not start within four minutes of the starting signal will be assessed as a No-Start (DNS) surfer without a hearing. This modifies RRS rules A5.1 and A5.2.
- 14.6 Warning signals for the following races will be given as soon as possible.

OBJECTIVE 15

15.1 In all classes, surfers may choose to finish after completing one lap. The definition of finishing in this case is supplemented by the requirement that the competitor must signal "silver group" to the race organizers, who will confirm this.

16. TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

16.1 The time limits and target times (in minutes) are as follows.

If no surfer has left the first mark within the time limit at the first mark, the race organiser shall declare the race void. Failure to meet the finishing time shall not be grounds for a medical appeal. This modifies RRS 61.4(b)(1).

16.2 Surfs that do not finish within the finish window (the time after the first surfer to finish in a given class and category) will be scored as DNF without discussion. This modifies RRS 35, rules A5.1 and A5.2.

17. WIND SPEED LIMITS

17.1 For the classes listed in the table below, when the wind speed measured by the race organizers is less than the indicated limit, the race organizers may postpone the start of a race or invalidate a race that has already started.

17.2 Decisions made by the race committee based on wind speed limits shall not be the basis for a remedial appeal. This modifies RRS 61.4(b)(1).

18. [DP] [NP] SECURITY

18.1 RRS 40.1 applies throughout the entire time on the water (wearing a lifejacket is mandatory).

18.2

In the Hungarian championship rounds, each club is required to provide 1-10 people, one for each competitor under 18 years of age, and one coach and a coach motorboat for every additional 10 people (from 11 people)! Smaller clubs or clubs without a motorboat can cooperate with another club, but then the total number of competitors of the two clubs must be calculated.

- 18.3 The responsible race organizer is responsible for checking the number of organizing and accompanying motorcyclists and making decisions on the conduct of the races based on this.
- 18.4 It is the sole decision of the responsible race organizer whether to organize a race in a storm signal, each adult competitor decides for himself whether to go on the water, and in the case of competitors under the age of 18, it is the decision of his own coach whether to allow his competitors to go on the water or not.
- 18.5 In Open Foil, iQFOiL and Foil Slalom classes, competitors must wear a helmet.
- 18.6 Surfers who do not leave the shore for a scheduled race must notify the race office immediately.
- 18.7 Surfboards that retire from a race
 - (a) if possible, notify the competition organisers before leaving the competition area, or
 - (b) notify the competition office as soon as possible.
- 18.8 AP over H means posted on the shore: "Surfs shall not leave the shore until further notice." This supplements the AP over H section of the RRS Racing Signals.
- 18.9 When required by the Competition Instructions, the following check-in and check-out system applies:
 - (a) Before each launch on competition days, each competitor must sign-out by personally signing the required form.
 - (b) Within 30 minutes of landing, but no later than the protest deadline, each competitor must sign-in on the prescribed form.

The Competition Instructions may require a procedure other than a personal signature.

19. REQUESTS FOR NEGOTIATION

- 19.1 The protest deadline for each class is 60 minutes, after which
 - (a) the last surf of the last race of the day has finished, or
 - (b) the sign "AP over A" or "N over A" is displayed.

However, when the mark "AP over A" is displayed on the shore, the protest deadline is 30 minutes after the mark is displayed. In the event of multiple incidents, the later time shall be considered.

- 19.2 Hearing request forms are available at the competition office, and hearing requests must be submitted there within the appropriate deadline.
- 19.3 Notices will be posted as soon as possible after the protest deadline to inform competitors of any hearings to which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the referees' room near the competition office.

20. OFFICIAL VESSELS

20.1 The official ship designations are listed in the table below.

20.2 The actions of official boats shall not form the basis of medical claims initiated by surfers. This amends rule RRS 61.1(a).

21. SCORING IN A COMPETITION

- 21.1 The completion of one race is required for the competition to be valid.
- 21.2 The sub-clauses of rule B8.A2 of RRS are amended as follows:
 - (a) "the score of the worst race after completing races 4 to 7,
 - (b) the score of the two worst races after the completion of races 8 to 11,
 - (c) the score of the three worst races after the completion of races numbered 12 to 15, or
 - (d) the four worst races after completing more than 15 races."
- 21.3 RRS 90.3(e) applies.
- 21.4 Non-Hungarian citizens may participate in the competition under the same conditions as Hungarian competitors and will be evaluated together.
- 21.5 Each category will be evaluated by recalculation per race.
- 21.6 The first surfer to finish in the silver group within the time limit will receive one more point than the last surfer to finish the entire course. The other surfers who finish in the silver group will be scored in order after him.
- 21.7 In the event of suspected errors in the posted results, surfers may request a review of the results by completing a form available at the competition office.

22. SCORING IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

- 22.1 When a valid race has been completed in a class, the championship series result will be the same as the race result.
- 22.2 When more than one valid race has been completed in a class:
 - (a) The results of the championship series shall be calculated using the scores of all races of all competitions, with the scores of each race being recalculated without the participation of competitors of non-Hungarian nationality. Competitors of non-Hungarian nationality shall not be included in the results of the Hungarian Championship.
 - (b) the championship series score is the sum of the scores from all races, excluding the worst score achieved in one-quarter of the total number of races (according to the general rules of rounding: below 0.5 rounded down, above 0.5 rounded up).
 - (c) ties shall be broken in accordance with RRS rule B8.A8.
- 22.3 Each category is evaluated by recalculation per race.
- 22.4 Competitors may request average points in competitions due to absence as follows:
 - (a) the competitor must submit a written request to the Presidency of the Hungarian Surfing Association at least 3 days before the relevant competition,
 - (b) the reason for the absence is participation in a foreign IWA, WS, IFCA or PWA ranking surfing competition, world championship, continental championship or world cup. (In the case of participation in additional competitions, the Board may make a decision based on individual assessment.)
 - (c) the competitor must submit proof of participation in the foreign competition (e.g. official results list) to the Presidency of the Hungarian Surfing Association.

If the athlete has participated in less than three valid competitions in the championship series, no average points for absence may be awarded. If he has participated in three or four competitions, he may be awarded average points for the races of a maximum of one competition, and if he has participated in at least five competitions, he may be awarded average points for the races of a maximum of two competitions. "Competition participation" means at least one valid race completed within the time limit in the given competition.

When calculating the average score, the scores obtained for the races of the affected competition(s) shall be equal to the average of the scores obtained in all races of the championship series excluding the affected races, rounded to the nearest tenth (0.05 rounded up).

22.5 The results of the championship series are www.hwa.hu In case of suspected errors in the published results, surfers may request a review of the results in a written request submitted to the office of the Hungarian Surfing Association within one week of publication.

23. PRIZES

- 23.1 The first three places in each category in a competition will receive medals.
- 23.2 In each category in the championship series:
 - (a) in the case of two or three competitors completing a valid race, the first place finisher,
 - (b) in the case of more than three surfs eligible for prizes, the first three places will receive prizes.
 - In the championship series, only surfers who sailed the course in at least one race and finished within the time limit are eligible for awards. In the Open Kid classes, the top three finishers in each category will receive awards, regardless of the number of eligible surfers.
- 23.3 The Hungarian Championship titles and rankings will be announced at the annual awards ceremony of the Hungarian Surfing Association. The venue and time will be announced atwww.hwa.hu information is provided on the website.

24. [DP] STORAGE OF SURFBOARDS

24.1 Surfboards must be stored in their designated place when on the beach.

25. [DP] SUPPORT VESSELS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

- 25.1 Support vessels are vessels that have at least one support person on board.
- 25.2 Sponsors' boats must be registered for the competition by their skippers during the registration period. Registered skippers are responsible for the control of the sponsor's boat throughout the competition and will be held accountable for any improper conduct, dangerous acts or activities that endanger the sportsmanship or safety of the competition.
- 25.3 The sail numbers of the sponsored surfboards must be provided upon registration; each surfboard must belong to a sponsor's boat. A sponsor's boat may sponsor a maximum of ten surfboards.
- 25.4 Support vessels are strongly advised to have a working VHF radio on board.
- 25.5 It is strongly recommended that support boat captains and crew on board wear a personal flotation device or life jacket at all times while on the water, when the engine is running.
- 25.6 The use of the roll-over lock is strongly recommended when the engine is running.
- 25.7 Support boats must remain outside the areas where surfers are competing and must not be in
 - (a) closer than 50 metres to any surfboard in competition,
 - (b) closer to the starting line on the leeward side or to the starting marks than 50 metres from the preparatory signal until all surfers have left the starting area or the race organiser has signalled a postponement, general recall or cancellation,
 - (c) between any surf in competition and the next course mark,
 - (d) closer than 50 metres to any course mark when the surfers are near the course mark, and
 - (e) closer than 25 metres to the finish line when the surfers finish.
- 25.8 Support boats must navigate around the competition area in such a way as to cause as little disturbance to competing surfers as possible by creating waves. Boats travelling faster than five knots must maintain a minimum distance of 150 metres from any competing surfer.
- 25.9 The restrictions in 25.7 and 25.8 do not apply to a support boat providing assistance to a surfer or competitor in distress.
- 25.10 Support boats must follow all instructions given by the race organisers via VHF radio. In the event of any conflict, these instructions will override the rules for support boats and support personnel.

26. MEDIA RIGHTS

26.1 By entering the championship series or competition, competitors automatically grant the organizing organization and competition sponsors the right to freely, at their own discretion, make, use and display at any time in any medium any film or photograph taken during the competition as per the competition regulations. By entering, competitors acknowledge that there is no compensation for their participation in such films or photographs.

27. RISK MANAGEMENT STATEMENT

27.1 RRS Rule 3 states: "It is the sole responsibility of the surfer to decide whether to participate in or continue in a competition." By participating in a competition, each competitor accepts and acknowledges that sailing (surfing) is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough waters, sudden changes in weather, equipment failure, errors in handling equipment, lack of skill by other surfers, loss of balance on an unstable surface and fatigue resulting in an increased risk of injury. The sport of sailing (surfing) involves the risk of permanent, accidental injury or death from drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

ANNEX 2 SLALOM FOIL AND SPEED CLASSES SUPPLEMENTARY RULES

SLALOM FOIL COMPETITION RULES

- SL1. COMPETITIONS
- SL1.1 The Hungarian Slalom Foil Championship is the Hungarian Championship competition held in Viganj (CRO) (June 21-22, 2025). For information on the time and location of the competition, and any possible changes, please contactwww.hwa.hu competitors will be informed on the website.
- SL2. SCORING
- SL2.1 The U17 and U19 categories will be evaluated in one competition and in the championship series by highlighting the absolute order, without recalculation. This modifies points 21.5 and 22.3 of the Competition Regulations.

SPEED RACING RULES

- SE1. COMPETITION FORM
- SE1.1 GPS 10-second highest average speed freesurfing.
- SE2. ELIGIBILITY, REGISTRATION AND REGISTRATION
- SE2.1 Surfers who are not participating in the championship series can enter the Speed Sports category. Only competitors who have not been among the top five in any Hungarian championship class or category in the past ten years can enter the Speed Sports category. The entry fee for the Speed Sports category is 5,000 HUF per person.
- SE2.2 Registration for participants in the championship series, and entry for participants in the Speed Sport category, takes place at the competition venue, every competition day between 9:30 and 17:00 at the competition office.
- SE3. CONDUCT
- SE3.1 To accept a competitor's result, the following GPS usage conditions must be met, and the competitor must adhere to the following requirements:
 - (a) Register your GPS with the Race Director prior to your first valid run of the day.
 - (b) The Race Director will attach the GPS to the competitor's arm or upper body.

- (c) During the remaining active period, it is prohibited to change the GPS recording or placement. In case of any change, the result of the entire period will not be evaluated.
- (d) A competitor may only wear one registered GPS at a time.
- (e) Every 60 minutes, the competitor must report to the race director for a reading, who will then upload the results from the GPS to a computer, verify them, and post them on the notice board. If the competitor reports to the race director after 65 minutes, his/her result will automatically be void. (In justified cases, the race director may change the time limit to 90 minutes).
- (f) Protest: the intention to protest must be notified to the competition director and the protest form must be requested. Protests are only possible on the given competition day.
- (g) Only 5 Hz GPS devices (e.g. GT-31, BGT-31, GW-52, GW-60 and GW31) may be used in the competition. The competitor must provide the competition director with the software required for downloading and the connection cable required for uploading upon registration.
- (h) The GPS speed stages of the Hungarian Speed Championship can be completed by the competitions at their own discretion, at the given competition venues, on the given competition days, at any time between 10:00 and 18:00, except if the competition is cancelled or shortened.
- SE3.2 GPS rental options on site: The competition organizers can provide a limited number (15 pcs) of GPS rental options on site. These GPSs can be rented for 60 (90) minute periods. The rental fee is 2,000 HUF/day (one-time fee, not continuous rental). If there is no competitor on the waiting list who has ridden the rented GPS fewer times than the competitor who has just finished his race, then the competitor has the opportunity to take the GPS for another 60 (90) minutes. When it comes to GPS rentals, those competitors who have used the service fewer times always have priority.
- SE4. SCORING
- SE4.1 The Hungarian Speed Championship is judged based on GPS results, with a single speed parameter being considered, which is the "best 10-second average speed". The championship title is won by the competitor who achieves the best result during the competition time on the specified competition dates based on GPS results verified by the competition director, i.e. produces the fastest average speed during any 10 seconds of their registered surfing time.
- SE4.2 The further order of the competitors is based on the descending order of these results. The best result of each competitor must be taken into account in the evaluation. The results of the Speed Sport category cannot be included in the results of the Speed Hungarian Championship.
- SE4.3 Tie: If two or more competitors have the same result to within one thousandth of a second, the result will be declared the same. At the start of each
- SE4.4 competition, the results up to and including the last competition will be posted on the official notice board. The results will be available continuously during the competition at the competition office and on the official notice board.
- SE4.5 The results of the competition will be announced within 48 hours after the end of the competition.www.hwa.hu are published on the website.
